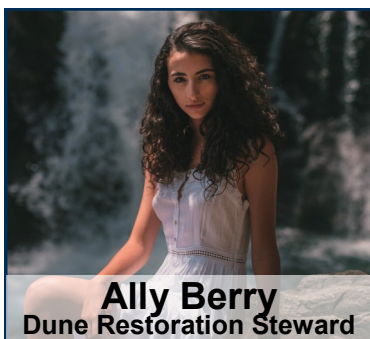

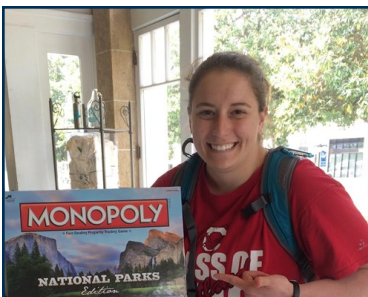

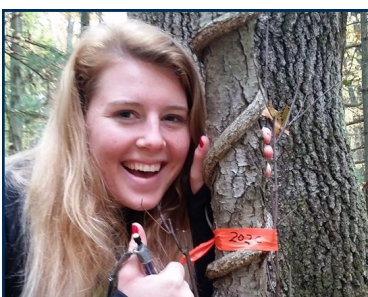
Garret Boleslav

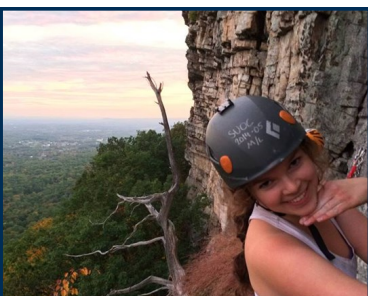
Ashlee Boughton

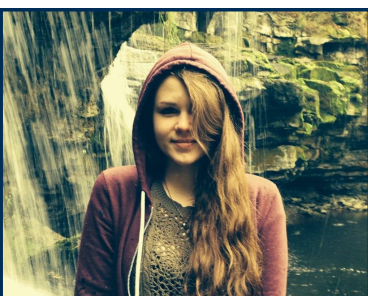
Cindy Brownson

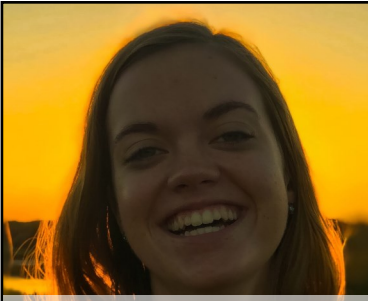
Stephanie Chase

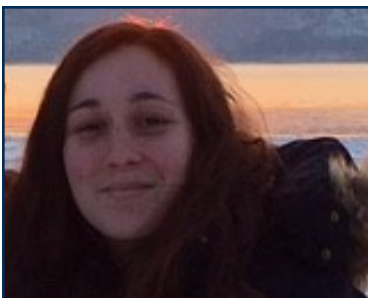
Elisa Colon

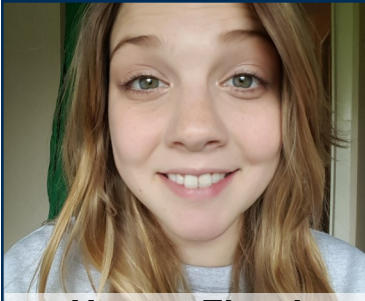
Hajar Faal

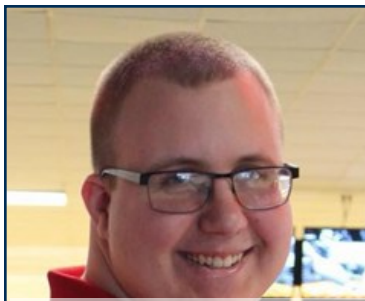
Marisa Flannery

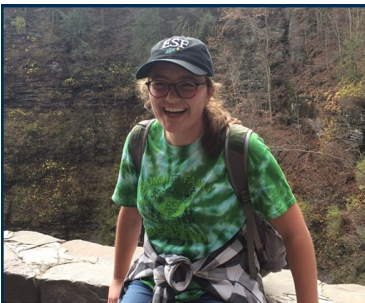
Hunter Flood

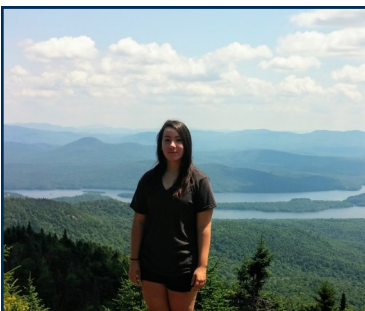
Megan Gorss

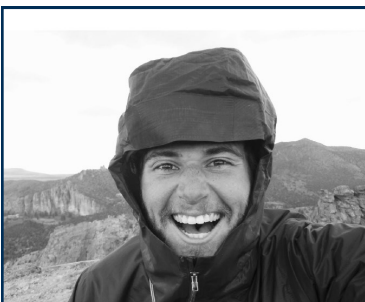
Julia Greco

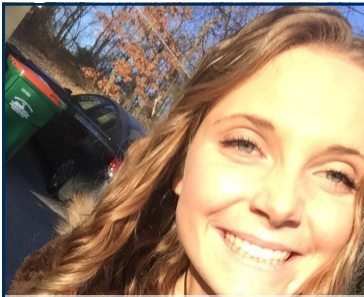
Juliana Isnardi

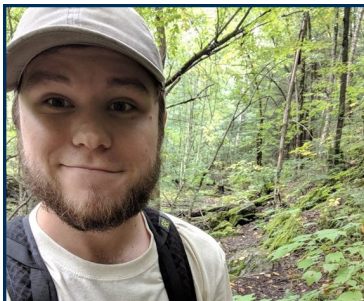
Spencer King

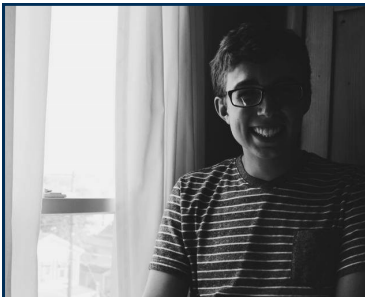
Paula Merkle

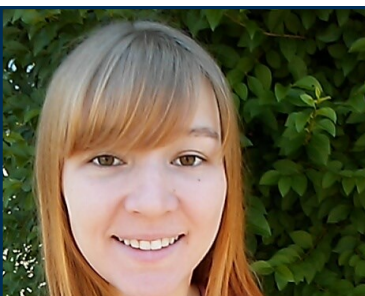
Thomas Minett

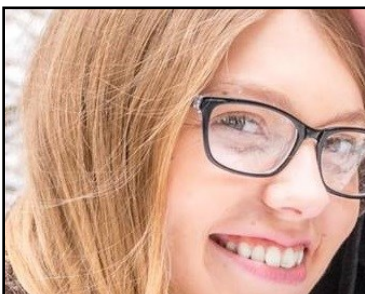
Miles Neidorf

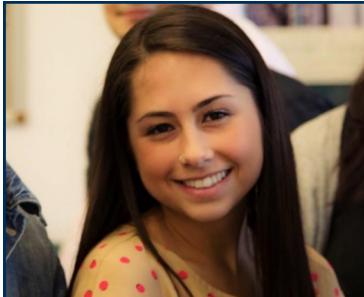
Kali Oaks

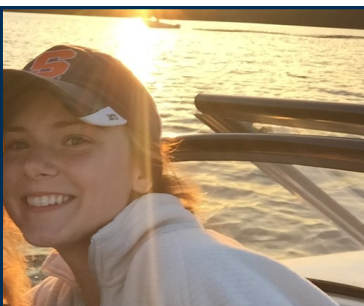
Elizabeth Padgett

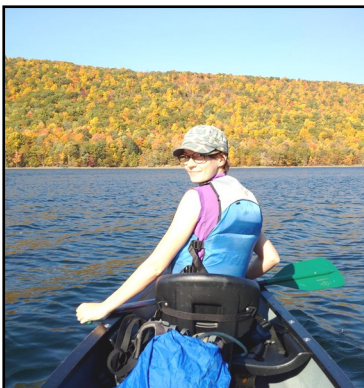
2018 FORCES Team

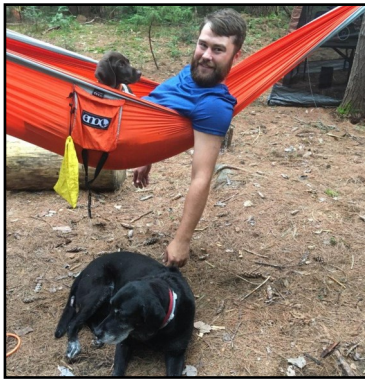


Adele Wellman

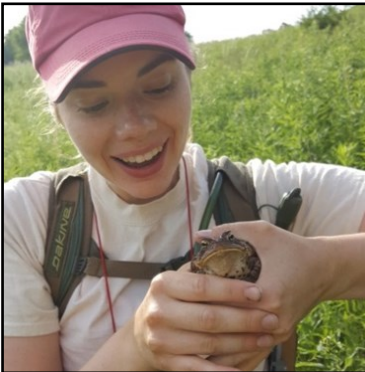

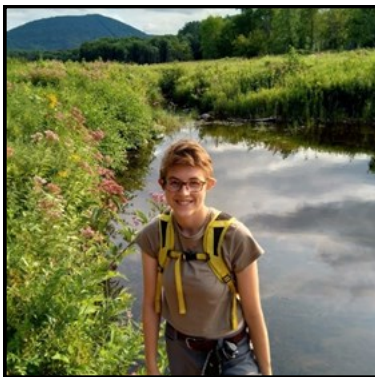
Kyle Webster
