1	1.5.3 Woody Invasive Approach1	9	I come to understand that during the end of December and the beginning of January (Between timeframe 1 and timeframe 2) during the cut stump woody invasive work, there is to be a bat and bird nest survey, Are you looking for any specifics during this survey such as specific nesting species, tallys, old nests, presence of birds ect? I just want to know if there is anything special you would like us to look for please let us know.	The surveys are to look for the presence of birds or bats in the trees/shrubs to be taken down and such surveys are to be performed prior to treatments occurring during Timeframe 2, January 1st to October 31st of any year.
2	1.5.2 and 1.5.3	9	Is contractor responsible for grubbing out the roots after the herbicide application?	No grubbing will occur as part of this project.
3	1.5.2	9	Can a Dingo on tracks or skid streer on tracks with a brush hog be used to cut the plant material down to the 2" mark?	As per the specs, "The Contractor shall provide and apply diluted herbicide directly to the stems of target species that have been freshly cut to a height of 2" or flush with the ground using clippers, brush saws or other hand tools (i.e., no tractors or riding mowers)."  A "brush hog" will not leave a cut stem on the woody invasives that can be easily treated with herbicide, and therefore will not be acceptable for this service.
4		11	Where is the erosion and sediment control located on the project, if any? It is not indicated on the drawings.	The erosion and sediment control will be determined based on site specifics by the Contractor in coordination with the Owner's Representative.
