Bowman Lake State Park is a remote sylvan retreat. The 653 acre park is surrounded by 11,000 acres of DEC forest land, which lends a unique and special wilderness aspect for all to enjoy!

Bird watchers can enjoy a multitude of viewing opportunities. The Chenango Bird Club is instrumental in keeping an inventory of the bird population in the park, and reported 77 different species during one survey. Among the sightings are geese, ducks, finches, warblers, hawks, and woodpeckers.

Lucky visitors may encounter a wide variety of wildlife including white-tailed deer, red fox, woodchuck, raccoon, gray squirrel, cottontail rabbit and beaver. For those interested in botanical aspects of the park, there are magnificent mosses, ferns (Christmas, lady and wood ferns are the most common), and trees.

Towering maples, American beech, black cherry and white and yellow birch, white ash, red pine and dogwood abound.

Did you know that people have seen 77 species of birds at Bowman Lake State Park?
