BOOK A PROGRAM

You are invited to bring your group on a field trip to Clay Pit Ponds State Park Preserve!

Who?

Any group leader can book a private program with us; **including classroom and homeschool teachers, scout and club leaders**. For most programs, we can host up to 60 participants. To ensure that all NYC residents have equal access to a guided forest experience, our programs are **FREE** of charge.

What?

We teach hands-on **environmental education** programming for NYC residents in order to connect people to nature and foster stewardship of our environment.

Where?

Clay Pit Ponds State Park Preserve is a 265-acre forest containing habitats unique to New York State and over 160 species of birds. Nestled amongst this urban greenspace is the **Nature Interpretive Center** which provides an indoor area for conducting a wide variety of programs and classes.

Transportation Grants

The Connect-Kids-to-Parks Field Trip Grant Program is designed to connect students in NYS with nature and history. Each grant provides reimbursement of up to \$40 per student (and \$80 for Special Education students) for field trips to state and federal parks, forests, historic sites, fish hatcheries, and outdoor recreation areas. When?

Programming is offered year-round. Our hours are **Tuesdays through Saturdays**, 8:30 am—5:00 pm.



PROGRAMS

Nature Explorers

Get outside and experience the forest!

- All ages, best for young students and those with special needs
- April—October
- Outdoor only, up to 1-mile hike

Maple Syrup Science

Learn about the entire process of creating maple syrup, from tap to table, and help us make some of our own!

- All ages
- January—February
- Indoor & outdoor activities, up to 1/2-mile hike

Tree Huggers

Learn about trees' needs and the different types of trees that grow in our Park. Make a leaf rubbing to take home!

- All ages
- May—early November
- Indoor OR outdoor, up to 1-mile hike

Farm Tour

Tour the historic Gericke Farm and learn what it takes to grow food. The farm includes a 1/2 acre vegetable patch, greenhouse, orchard, and chicken coop.

- All ages, limit 30 participants
- April—October 2022
- Outdoor only



Animal Detectives

Search for clues that wildlife leave behind. What do animals need to survive in the forest?

- Grades K-2, ages 7 & younger
- Year-round
- Outdoor only, up to 1-mile hike

Brave Birds

Appreciate the marvel of migration and learn about how humans affect global populations of birds.

- Grades 3–6, ages 8–13, limit 30 participants
- October, early November, late March, April, & May
- Indoor & outdoor activities, up to 1/2-mile hike

Adapt to Survive

Why do roses have thorns? Why do ducks have webbed feet? Discover these answers and more in this adaptation-focused lesson.

- Grades 3—5, ages 8—10
- Year-round
- Indoor & outdoor activities, up to 1/2-mile hike

Navigating Naturalists

Hunt for treasure and learn to navigate our trails using various types of maps.

- Grades 3—8, ages 8—13
- March—November
- Indoor & outdoor activities, up to 1-mile hike



Invasive Species Solutions

Learn about the damage that invasive species do to our Preserve and solutions to this issue.

- Grades 6—12, ages 11 & up
- Year-round
- Outdoor only, up to 1 mile hike

Oh, Deer!

The deer on Staten Island love our Park! Observe the effects of overpopulation.

- Grades 6-12, ages 11 & up
- Year-round
- Outdoor only, 1 mile hike

Math Trails

Hike the Clay Pit math trail! Can you solve it all?

- Grades 6—12, ages 11 & up
- Year-round
- Outdoor only, 1 mile hike

History Hike

Learn about the history of Clay Pit Ponds State Park Preserve.

- Grades 6—12, ages 11 & up
- Year-round
- Indoor OR outdoor, up to 1-mile hike

Pond Investigators

Become a community scientist! Conduct a field study to test the health of our ponds.

- Grades 8-12, ages 13 and up
- April—July
- Outdoor only, up to 1/2 mile hike



Explore Other Options...


• An Inquiry into the Scientific Method: complete the steps of the scientific method in this 4-part lesson. On day 1, make observations and ask a question. On day 2, gather more information, form a testable hypothesis, and design an experiment. On day 3, conduct the experiment and analyze results. On day 4, report your results to the class and audience in a mini-poster session.

 Agents of Discovery hike: combine technology with nature through an augmented reality nature quest through our trails.

• Food web demonstration: build a food web in an interactive game and then hike to observe the web of life at Clay Pit!

• Art in the Park: write poems, stories, sketch, or paint out on the trails.

• Topic specific program: do a deep dive into a specific environmental topic such as pollination, reduce/reuse/recycle, climate change, and more!

These programs have an outdoor component. Please dress for tick safety by wearing long pants, tall socks, and sneakers or boots. Bug spray may be provided. Educators discuss tick awareness during the events.

CANCELLATION POLICY



We reserve the right to cancel a program in the event of an emergency, weather-related or otherwise. Outdoor programs will be cancelled for the following reasons: temperatures below 25°F, heavy rain, lightning, thunder, high winds, or other extreme weather emergencies. If your program must be cancelled due to inclement weather, you will be contacted no later than 9:00 am on the morning of the program. You will be given the option to run an indoor program. Otherwise, available dates may be suggested for rescheduling.
