Obtaining a New York State Public Vessel License with a USCG License.

1. Persons holding a USCG license that wish to obtain a Joint Pilot \& Engineers License or Apprentice Master License for Public Vessel must:
a. Complete and submit an Application for License to the Bureau of Marine Services
b. Provide a copy of their drivers license
c. Provide a copy of their USCG license, front and back if applicable
d. List applicable marine experience.
e. Submit a letter from the owner of the boat indicating their interest in having you as a licensed operator for their PV.
2. At the discretion of the inspector an applicant with a USCG license may be exempt from a written exam. Reasons for requiring the exam may include, but not limited to, lack of experience on one's license, or no boating experience in New York waters.
3. Upon receiving an apprentice master's license you will be required to train under the supervision of a licensed master for that boat for a required number of hours. Depending upon your experience on like-sized boats you may be asked to make a minimum of 20, 30 or 60 trips under the guidance of a licensed Master on the vessel for which you are seeking a master's license. This office will start counting your hours after you make application to this office. Hours trained prior to the issuance of an Apprentice Master license will not be considered as applicable.

4. New York State Navigation Law requires a marine inspector to examine the qualification of an applicant prior to issuing a license. In New York State this office believes that on a larger vessel a practical exam rather than a written exam is better deteminant of a person's qualifications to safely operate a public vessel. Once you have completed the required number of hours and the owner is confident in your abilities the owner of the boat shall contact this office in writing to request a practical exam.
5. Your practical exam will be on the boat you are to be licensed for. It may be a regular scheduled trip with passengers, or a special trip for the purpose of testing, with just a few crew members. In either case, a licensed master must be on board during the exam. Your exam will consist of your knowledge of the boat, the water you are operating on, fire and emergencies, man overboard, docking and undocking and seamanship.
