## **INSTRUCTIONS**

**Block 1:** Provide your name as it appears on your driver license, passport or USCG license. The address you provide should be the one where you may be contacted for information regarding your license in the future. It is also the address to which the license will be sent unless you are employed by a person or company who is paying for the license.

**Block 2:** Enter two digits each for the month, day, and year of your birth. For example, a birth date of August 2, 1961 would be entered as 08 02 61. Applicants seeking an apprentice master license must be at least twenty-one years of age at the time of application.

**Block 3:** Please specify the type of identification, driver license or passport, you will attach to this license to verify your identity.

**Block 4:** Enter the type of license(s) that you currently possess. Attach a copy of your active USCG license; depending on the format of your license front and back or all pages. This application will not be accepted without copies of your last USCG license.

**Block 5:** Indicate the name of the person and/or company that you intend to be working for.

**Block 6:** Enter a summary of your last 5 marine related jobs. Use the remarks section on the back for additional information that may better describe your marine background. Enter the type of propulsion of the vessels served on. Was it motor steam or sail, single screw or twin screw, paddle wheel, or auxiliary sail?

**Block 7:** A yes answer to any of these questions requires a detailed explanation. A yes answer does not necessarily mean that you will be denied a license. The inspector may, however, require additional information and/or documentation to be certain that the nature of the problem or reason for the conviction will not create a risk to passengers of your vessel or for other vessels on the water. Failure to answer these questions constitutes grounds for denial of license.

**Block 8: SIGN AND DATE THE APPLICATION!!** The application will not be accepted without a signature.

If this is your first license issued by this office you must also send a check for \$20 made out to "NYS Parks" along with this application.

Obtaining a New York State Public Vessel License with a USCG License.

- 1. Persons holding a USCG license that wish to obtain a Joint Pilot & Engineers License or Apprentice Master License for Public Vessel must:
  - a. Complete and submit an Application for License to the Bureau of Marine Services
  - b. Provide a copy of their drivers license
  - c. Provide a copy of their USCG license, front and back if applicable
  - d. List applicable marine experience.
  - e. Submit a letter from the owner of the boat indicating their interest in having you as a licensed operator for their PV.
- 2. At the discretion of the inspector an applicant with a USCG license may be exempt from a written exam. Reasons for requiring the exam may include, but not limited to, lack of experience on one's license, or no boating experience in New York waters.
- 3. Upon receiving an apprentice master's license you will be required to train under the supervision of a licensed master for that boat for a required number of hours. Depending upon your experience on like-sized boats you may be asked to make a minimum of 20, 30 or 60 trips under the guidance of a licensed Master on the vessel for which you are seeking a master's license. This office will start counting your hours after you make application to this office. Hours trained prior to the issuance of an Apprentice Master license will not be considered as applicable.

USCG license, similar boat experience 20 trips USCG license, 1st issue, or no exerience 30 trips JP&E license only 60 trips

- 4. New York State Navigation Law requires a marine inspector to examine the qualification of an applicant prior to issuing a license. In New York State this office believes that on a larger vessel a practical exam rather than a written exam is better determinant of a person's qualifications to safely operate a public vessel. Once you have completed the required number of hours and the owner is confident in your abilities the owner of the boat shall contact this office in writing to request a practical exam.
- 5. Your practical exam will be on the boat you are to be licensed for. It may be a regular scheduled trip with passengers, or a special trip for the purpose of testing, with just a few crew members. In either case, a licensed master must be on board during the exam. Your exam will consist of your knowledge of the boat, the water you are operating on, fire and emergencies, man overboard, docking and undocking and seamanship.
