- Preserve Land acquisitioned after 1993 designated a Park Preserve under the Park Preservation Law (Article 20)
- Bird Conservation Area Undeveloped and suitable recent acquisitions added to the BCA.
- Natural Heritage Area The Preserve is designated a Natural Heritage Area

Carrying Capacity

 Continue to control quantity of use through parking and monitor the carrying capacities within the Preserve.

Natural Resource Plans

- Invasive Species Continue to implement the Invasive Species Management Plan
- Fire Management Support the Shawangunk Ridge Fire Management Plan to enhance and promote biodiversity and reduce wildfire threats.
- Deer Management Deer management strategies are supported. Monitor biodiversity threats within the Preserve
- Hunting Allowed and expanded in Preserve based on biodiversity needs.
- Lake Habitat Further study of aquatic habitat is required.

Design Guidelines

- The design character will be rustic and cognizant of the surrounding natural features and history of the area.
- Consider sustainable practices.

Construction Practices

- Shall be considerate of the landscape, historic character and vegetation. Straw for erosion control will be certified
- weed free. Consider sustainable practices.

Landscaping

• Landscaping will consist of native vegetation

Carriage Roads

- The existing uses and designations
- will remain. Maintenance Plan will be implemented.
- Footpaths • The Long Path - The expansion of The Long Path in the Mine Hole Area
- is recommended. The Scenic Trail will be rerouted to its previous location on the South side of Mud Pond.
- Footpath provided connecting the Awosting parking lot to the Lake Minnewaska beach

Sustainability


Sustainable concepts will be implemented in all aspects of the preserve where practical. These areas include: operations, management, design, construction and education.

Interpretation and Education Continue to foster a sense of environmental stewardship through hands-on interpretive programming.


- Programming will focus on topics including but not limited to climate change, sustainability, fire ecology, invasive species and species diversity.


Campground
