Summary

This policy establishes the general circumstances under which antennas or other communication equipment may be installed on property under the jurisdiction of OPRHP.

Policy

Consistent with OPRHP's mission statement, the agency has determined that it may not be appropriate to allow antennas or other communications equipment on property under the jurisdiction of the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation.

Permits may only be issued as follows:

- Permits to governmental agencies to install towers, antennas, or other communication equipment on state park land may be issued only for the purposes of protecting public health, safety and welfare.
- Permits to non-governmental entities to install towers, antennas, or other communication equipment on state park land will not be issued unless OPRHP determines that a clear public need is served and that no unreasonable adverse environmental or visual impact will result.
