## “You Would Not Know the Landing!” Archaeological Investigation of the Revolutionary War Campsites of the Crown Forces at Raritan Landing in Piscataway, NJ

Thursday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, 7 P.M.

British and Hessian troops occupied Raritan Landing in Piscataway, New Jersey from January until June of 1777. The troops left behind a changed community; a shell of its former self. Over two decades of archaeological investigations have revealed rich deposits associated with the British occupation of the site. This well-illustrated presentation by archaeologist Richard Veit of Monmouth University examines those finds and what they can tell us about the organization and activities of the Crown forces during a critical period in the American Revolution.
