2. Describe nature and extent of action:

The Proposed Action is the development of the core elements or trail components of the Hudson Highlands Fjord Trail, including 7.5 miles of Main Trail and 6.5 miles of Trail Meanders, and would include Trail Banks, Water Trail Connections, and Regional Trail connections. This consistency review covers Fjord Trail South, which is the two-mile southern portion of the proposed Fjord Trail from Dockside Park in Cold Spring to the southern end of the Breakneck Connector and Bridge Project at Breakneck Ridge. Approximately 1.5 miles of the trail would be within the Town of Philipstown between Little Stony Point and Breakneck Ridge, and 0.5 miles of the trail would be within the Village of Cold Spring between Dockside Park and Little Stony Point. Elevated trail sections would be constructed between the railroad tracks and the Hudson River from Breakneck Ridge to Little Stony Point and on the west side of the railroad causeway from Dockside Park to Little Stony Point. At-grade trail sections are proposed for Little Stony Point and Dockside Park, and restroom buildings would be constructed along the trail in Little Stony Point and Dockside Park.
