#### Tornado Blowdown

August 28 1990 at 6:15pm in the evening, Allegany State Park was struck by a tornado, considered by

many as one of the most violent of meteorological disturbances. Although tornadoes have touched down in the park in the past, this particular storm hit the heart of the Quaker Run Area and caused considerable damage to several forested areas. Join us to see how nature recovers.

The Allegany 18 is a collection of the 18 original hiking trails in Allegany State Park, totaling 70 miles. Individual packets are available for \$20.00 (includes tax) at the Red House Rental Office. located in the Red House Admin.

Each packet includes 19 maps with interesting information about the trail and a pencil to etch the golden trail markers found on each trail. Once you have hiked all the trails, show the completed maps with etchings to the Rental Office or bring them to a Naturalist to receive your custom Allegany 18 water bottle and sticker.

#### The Centennial 7 Hiking Program

The Centennial 7 hiking challenge will introduce you to over 20 miles of some of the oldest and newest trails in Allegany State Park.
