

Any sailboat operating with an electric motor, outboard, inboard, inboard/outdrive, jet drive motor of any length.

<a href="#">Registration</a>	Registration is needed when an electric motor, or a gasoline, propane or diesel engine is attached. You must have the boat registration certificate on board and validation stickers displayed.
<a href="#">Life Jackets</a>	One for each person, properly sized, readily accessible and in good serviceable condition and US Coast Guard approved
<a href="#">Life Jacket to be worn</a>	Under 12 years of age at all times when underway on a sailboat less than 65 feet except when in a fully enclosed cabin  If the sailboat is less than 21 feet all passengers must wear a PFD from Nov 1 to May 1.
<a href="#">Throwable flotation device</a>	Required if greater than or equal to 16 feet
<a href="#">Sound Producing device</a>	Yes, mouth whistle is acceptable if vessel is under 39 feet in length
<a href="#">Bell</a>	Not required unless the sailboat is over 39 feet
<a href="#">Anchor and line</a>	Required
<a href="#">Backfire Flame arrestor</a>	Only if the engine is a gas or diesel inboard engine
<a href="#">Fire Extinguisher</a>	Yes, click on the link to find the number and type of extinguisher required.
<a href="#">Visual Distress signal</a>	Sailboats over 16 feet equipped with mechanical power are required to carry daytime visual distress and nighttime visual distress signals.
<a href="#">Navigation Lights</a>	Yes, lights are required at night and restricted visibility. When under sail only must carry red and green side lights and sternlight. When operating under power you must add the mast head light.
<a href="#">Capacity Plate</a>	Not required
<a href="#">Muffled exhaust</a>	Not required for electric motor, required on all other engines.
