Dive further into the histories of the people of Clermont with our Visitor Center exhibit, "Spero Meliora: Life in The Land of Livingston." Two special exhibits are on view this season, "Redefining The Family: The Livingstons and the Institution of Slavery" and "The Matriarch of Clermont: Margaret Beekman at 300." After your tour, check out our Poetry in the Parks installation, displayed on the outer wall of the Visitor Center, take

Those Who Served: The Enslaved and Paid Servants of Clermont Saturday, February 15, 2025 at 2pm Mansion-Meets at the Visitor Center \$10 for adults, \$8 for seniors and students, and children under 12 are free.

Over the course of more than 200 years, hundreds of people worked at

Clermont to keep the Livingston family comfortable. For nearly a century, the mansion was run by a mostly enslaved staff. By the 1830s, this staff was completely replaced by paid labor.

Though many of their stories were lost, recent research has revealed new details about those who worked for the Livingston family. From Old Cole, a black man enslaved by Chancellor Livingston, to Shige Toshio, a Japanese immigrant who served as the Livingston's butler, to Ollie and Christopher Meyer, two young people from different continents who found love in Clermont's kitchen, join us as we uncover some of the stories of those who served. The tour also delves into the realities of enslavement, immigration, and employment across three centuries.





HUDSON HIGHLANDS STATE PARK PRESERVE: NORTH REDOUBT TRAIL

Distance: 0.59 miles

Difficulty Rating: Moderate



Located just ten minutes south of Cold Spring, the North Redoubt trail is perfect for a quick afternoon hike. This trail is located on Snake Hill Road, in Garrison NY. The parking lot can be found on the Northern side of the Hudson Highland Land Trust property, at the bottom of the hill. North Redoubt is considered a moderate trail due to its steady climb and narrow footpath. This is an out and back trail for a total of 1.18 miles. At its peak, there is a gorgeous view of the Hudson River. Winter can be an excellent time of year for this hike since the view is restricted by the canopy cover in the warmer seasons. This trail is ideal for a short hike in the woods, that'll still get your heartrate up. Come hike North Redoubt and take in the beautiful wintery views of the Hudson Valley!
