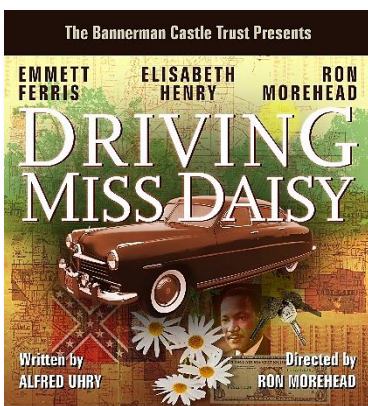

Enjoy a free, easy, 2 miles/hours (total) loop hike north along the Aqueduct and atop the beautiful Croton Dam. Meet near the restrooms at the rear (south end) of the parking lot at Croton Gorge Park, Rte. 129, Cortlandt, NY. 10567, GPS Coordinates: 41.22603, -73.85770. The leader of the hike will discuss the history and construction of the Old Croton Aqueduct and the features of the Croton Dam, the trailhead of the Old Croton Aqueduct Trail. The Aqueduct was completed in 1842 to supply fresh water to a thirsty New York City. (From Metro-North Hudson Line Croton-Harmon Train Station: 15-minute taxi.) **Note:** Parking fee for Croton Gorge Park is \$10. Walk may be

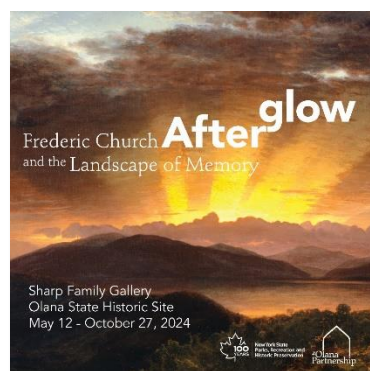

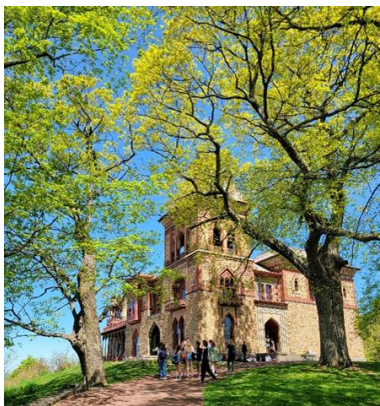

Cornish Trail:

Hudson Highlands State Park Preserve

Distance: 2.5 miles

Difficulty rating: Easy to Moderate

One of the most popular trails in Hudson Highlands State Park Preserve, the Cornish Trail begins at the Washburn Parking lot near Little Stony Point and leads you to Breakneck Ridge, passing by the Cornish Estate ruins along the way. Becoming gradually more difficult as you venture deeper into the park this trail offers a little bit for everyone. It's about 0.8 miles from the trailhead to the ruins of the old mansion where you can observe the remaining stone pillars and fireplaces. Then hikers can choose to continue up the Cornish Trail, following the Breakneck Brook for an additional mile until reaching the old dairy barn. More adventurous hikers can then accent the Cornish Trail to Breakneck Ridge to take in views of the Hudson Valley and connect to other trails throughout the preserve.
