#### **SUMMARY**

The Center Square/Hudson Park Historic District was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1980; the district nomination was the result of two surveys undertaken in the mid-late 1970s of the Center Square and Hudson-Park neighborhoods. These surveys identified one large cohesive and contiguous primarily residential area in Albany just west of the central business district that also included six churches, various office and service buildings, and a few industrial buildings and documented a concentrated period of development between 1845 and 1920. The surveys recorded the history and architecture of the district in those years from the earliest surviving buildings up to and including all those buildings that were fifty years old at the time of the nomination. Contributing resources encompassed a broad range of architectural styles within this period. At the time of nomination, the history of the district in the decades after 1920 was not chronicled, and several important buildings constructed in the period between 1949 and 1957 were too young to be evaluated. The goal of this additional documentation is to update that narrative and chronicle the history of this section of Albany during the middle decades of the twentieth century. Nine additional resources that represent this period and that are similar in thematic associations are now being documented as contributing to the district. No new area is being added or removed from the district and the boundary remains as it was in the original district. The new documentation simply expands the period of significance, provides appropriate supporting contextual information, and assesses additional buildings as contributing. Not every building constructed between 1849 and 1957 was deemed contributing. Buildings totally out of scale and character with the neighborhood and/or not representing a significant theme remain non-contributing.

Because of its early date, the original district lacked a resource list. This submission also provides a complete list of resources with descriptions that notes changes to the buildings since the original nomination. The new list also provides a more accurate building count and updates the status of any buildings that may have been altered or restored since 1980. New photographs have also been provided. Now that nearly fifty years have passed, Albany's history in the period after 1920 has undergone much study and analysis, as has the larger theme of Modern architecture. The updated nomination documents a period of significance from 1849 to 1957 under criterion C, architecture.

#### Integrity and Contributing/Non-Contributing Criteria

In preparing the resource list, the following criteria were used to evaluate the contributing/non-contributing status of district buildings:

- Date: the building must have been present during the period of significance (1820-1957). Buildings constructed after the end of the period of significance are non-contributing.
- Location: the building must be in its original location or must have been moved to its present site during the period of significance.

In addition, the building must retain enough integrity of design, workmanship, materials, and feeling to convey its historic appearance and significance in the context of the district according to the following:

#### Form:

• The original form of a building must be legible. Alterations to a building that do not obscure its historic form and footprint are acceptable and considered contributing. Additions that significantly change or obscure the historic form are noncontributing with one exception: commercial buildings sometimes display a hybrid character – as in a residence converted to a store. If these changes have taken place during the period of significance, they are considered to contribute to the district under the theme of commerce.

#### Exterior cladding:

Contributing commercial buildings should retain a predominance of materials that date from the
period of significance, including both original and/or historic materials from upgrades up until
1955. Given the pressure on commercial owners to continually upgrade their buildings, more
contemporary materials (such as windows, see below) may have been added subsequently. The
building will remain contributing as long as these later materials do not significantly obliterate
design.

#### Fenestration:

• Replacement windows in the same openings do not make a building non-contributing as long as the trim and the size of the windows have been maintained. Replacement windows in altered openings may be acceptable if the original opening remains readable and can be restored. Replacement windows outside the period of significance that completely change the fenestration by removing all trim and/or changing window shape or location render buildings non-contributing. An isolated window (or windows) may be ignored if the building meets other integrity measures.

#### Storefronts:

 Alteration of storefronts is a common and expected change made to most commercial buildings, as owners sought to attract new generations of shoppers and as businesses changed. Loss of original design and materials on the first floor does not make a building non-contributing if the upper floors retain integrity.

#### Streetscape:

- The building continues to contribute to the continuity of the streetscape.
- Integrity of Design: Changes during the period of significance that reflect original or long-term functions are acceptable if the changes themselves retain integrity. Buildings with two primary elevations, one which retains full integrity and one which does not, will be considered contributing. Additionally, buildings must retain their original scale. Changes in scale that reflect new uses may be considered contributing based on an assessment of other elements of integrity.
- Buildings that are categorized as non-contributing may be re-evaluated if materials that obscure
  original form, scale, design, materials, and workmanship are removed, and original or historic
  elements are rediscovered. This guideline acknowledges that blocked windows may be
  unblocked, facades may be removed to reveal the original wall treatment, and other changes may
  be reversed that will enable a building to contribute to the district.

The majority of residential, commercial, institutional, religious, and mixed-use buildings constructed in the district during the height of development, 1820 and 1957, remain intact. The buildings that remain typically retain integrity of location, design, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association. Several of the older buildings have been altered by replacement of their original windows or removal of secondary details. Despite these losses, these buildings retain the other cited aspects of integrity. The Center Square Historic District remain a highly intact collection of historic buildings in this area of Albany.

#### **Resource Summary**

As re-evaluated in 2024, the district contains 1,104 contributing primary buildings, 1 contributing site, and 1 contributing structure. There are 46 non-contributing buildings and one non-contributing site, as well as 134 properties that are vacant or used for parking.

The resource list describes each building and structure in the district. However, the following buildings, constructed between 1920 and 1957, were specifically identified as intrusions in the 1980 nomination. Additional documentation provided here now supports their evaluation as contributing to the district under the expanded period of significance.

#### 21-25 Delaware Avenue

Property name: Boys' & Girls' Club of Albany

*Parcel Number:* 76.31-4-2

Description: A two-story rectangular yellow brick building with a flat roof and a one-story wing with a flat roof and a ribbon of windows framed by black tile running perpendicular to the brick portion. Fully glazed center entry with sidelights and transom.

History: Originally constructed as the Albany's Boy's Club. In 1950, Public School No. 24 (1891) was sited on this lot prior to its demolition.<sup>2</sup>

#### 85 Dove Street (353 Hamilton Street)

History: Prior to the construction of 85 Dove Street, this lot was the site of a store and storage facility.<sup>3</sup>

#### 255 Lark Street

Description: Two-story brick building with a flat roof and ribbons of windows with stone sills on the first and second floors. The second story projects out over the first story on the south elevation and is supported by slender metal columns. The ribbon of windows on the south elevation is interrupted in the center by a contrasting grouping of small rectilinear windows with stone sills.

History: Prior to the construction of 255 Lark Street, there were two stores dating back to the late nineteenth century on this site.<sup>4</sup>

#### 259 Lark Street

Property name: N/A

Date of Construction: ca. 1950s Status: one contributing building Parcel Number: 76.23-3-17

*Description*: A two-story brick and concrete building with a flat roof and ribbons of windows with stone sills on the first and second stories on its east and south elevations. Side entry features a double-height stone surround featuring a single window on the second story and a glazed aluminum double door on the first story.

History: Prior to the construction of 259 Lark Street, a dwelling was located on this site.<sup>5</sup>

#### 244 State Street (90 South Swan Street)

*Description*: Four-story, L-shaped brick building with horizontal bands of windows punctuating all floors. The flat roof is capped in stone.

*History*: In the 1970s, this was a commercial office building owned by the Santo Corporation.<sup>6</sup> Prior to its construction, a building that served as a dwelling and garage and earlier as a dwelling and stable, ca. 1890s, was previously sited on this lot.<sup>7</sup>

#### 258 State Street (75 Chestnut)

*Description*: A three-story red brick commercial building with a flat roof on a concrete foundation. Vinyl garage door and fully glazed vinyl-door on first story, with aluminum canopy above. *History*: Prior to its construction the site was an empty lot dating back to at least 1892. The current building was used as classroom and office space by Russell Sage College from 1953-1972.<sup>9</sup>

#### 324 State Street

*Description*: Two-story building with a flat roof clad in a common bond of blond brick. First and second stories feature a continuous band of metal ribbon windows with stone sills. Beside the entry to the north is a curved glass block wall above a granite base.

*History*: The building was named for the Picotte family, which was closely associated with community service and philanthropy in the Capital Region. It was used as classroom space for the College of St. Rose. Prior to that, it was occupied by the New York State Insurance Department.

#### 100 S. Swan Street

doors with transom and a decorative panel inlaid with gold paint separating the first and second floors. *History*: Prior to its construction, a three-story apartment (ca. late nineteenth century) and a one-story garage (both not extant) were sited on this lot. The apartment was originally a one-family home that had been divided into several units sometime between 1935 and 1950.

#### **SIGNIFICANCE**

The Center Square/Hudson Park District Additional Documentation documents nine intact examples of Modern architecture that illustrate the last phase of historic and architectural development in the large, primarily residential district located just west of Albany's major commercial and governmental center. All nine buildings are significant under criterion C in the area of architecture as distinctive, intact examples of their types that relate to themes important in the district's history. These buildings were constructed primarily on vacant lots and most of them were built to meet the increasing need for office space associated with the phenomenal growth of New York State government in the period after World War II. All nine were constructed during the 1950s and all embody a restrained Modern aesthetic marked by simple, geometric forms, large windows, and a lack of applied historicist ornament. Specifically, the majority are all one to three stores in size, rectangular in form, of steel-frame construction with brick veneer, and feature ribbon windows, flat overhanging roofs and canopies, and abstracted decorative motifs. They are modest in scale and use similar materials to the district's older buildings, while offering an update to the Victorian period styles that otherwise dominate the district. These buildings complete the catalogue of period types and styles documented in the original district nomination.

#### **Development of Center Square/Hudson Park before 1920**

Although the city of Albany dates from the seventeenth century, the area comprising this district did not develop until Albany's period of nineteenth-century expansion and prosperity. Albany was a small city with a population of less than 13,000 in 1820. Following the opening of the Erie Canal in 1825 the city grew rapidly, becoming an important transportation transfer point as well as a major lumber and grain distribution center. By 1840, Albany's population had risen to about 33,000 and it grew to 62,000 in 1865 and 90,000 in 1880.

The earliest settlement in the district was on its hilltops. In the 1840s the city's prosperity allowed the Ruttengill Creek to be filled from Hawk to Lark Streets and from Madison Avenue to State Street; housing began to be erected along the newly created streets. In contrast to earlier freestanding buildings in the district, rows of speculator-built, attached houses were frequently built after 1845. After this date even individually built houses were generally row houses. Maps of 1857, 1876, and 1891 show that the area developed steadily. The builders or speculators active in

the district included businessmen, carpenter-builders, and small investors who financed the construction of their own homes and an adjacent rental property or two. Buildings along a street were not the product of one builder but were constructed in varying styles and materials by numerous people over a span of years.

Overall, the district contains simple dwellings for working-class families as well as more elaborate homes for the middle class and wealthy. Additionally, during the nineteenth century, it had several breweries, a soap factory, blacksmith shops, lumber dealers, and similar enterprises. Isolated industrial buildings remain, most of which are relatively small in scale and have been converted to housing.

Proximity to Washington Park (created after 1869 just west of the district) and to the New York State Capitol building (1869, 1898), located near its northeast corner, made State Street [near the district's western spine] a very fashionable place to reside. Wealthy Albanians built lavish homes along it in a variety of high-style architectural designs. By1896, residents of practically every State Street house in the district were included in Albany's *Society List*.

The area south of Elm Street remained vacant longer than elsewhere in the district. Development here was probably inhibited by several factors: the sloping terrain, the partial isolation due to the ravine to the south, the distance from the center of the city, and the streetcar lines. By 1886, the ravine had become a public park (Lincoln Park, NR listed), but its slow improvement prevented it from being a growth catalyst as Washington Park had been.

#### Development in Center Square/Hudson Park after 1920

In the early twentieth century, the character of the neighborhood began to change. Several larger apartment buildings were erected and gradually many of the single-family homes were divided into apartments. Construction of the Alfred E. Smith State Office building began in 1926 at the northwest corner of South Swan and State Streets. This concrete high-rise with setbacks, which is just outside of Center Square in the abutting Washington Ave Corridor District, is a distinctive Art Deco-style building that stands at the other end of a park facing the NYS Capitol. New development in the district was stagnant through the Great Depression in the 1930s and World War II through the 1940s. In the wake of the post-war rush to suburbia, many of the stately town homes in the district were subdivided for multiple families, and lower-income residents moved in. A documentary produced by the network *WHMT* in 1980 discussed the overcrowding and the district's changing demographics. <sup>10</sup> The change from primarily wealthy, single-family homes to

densely populated blocks of crowded apartments led to a perception of decline in the community. This change of neighborhood character and perceived devaluation may have contributed to some demolitions in these years, providing open sites for new buildings constructed in the post-war period. The nine buildings now documented as contributing were constructed between 1949 and 1959. Of the nine, only one was built on a vacant lot of land; all the other buildings were constructed on lots that had formerly held small stores, a nineteenth-century school, dwellings, and apartments that were created from subdivided single family town homes and row houses. Six of the new buildings were constructed for commercial use, primarily as office space. Two of them were constructed as educational buildings and one as a civic building: Russell Sage College at 75 Chestnut Street (1953); Russell Sage College Extension at 254 State Street (ca. 1950); and the Boys' and Girls' Club of Albany at 21-25 Delaware Avenue (1956). <sup>11</sup>

During this period, office space was in high demand and one of the drivers of new construction in Albany was New York state government. When the thirty-four story Alfred E. Smith State Office Building was constructed in 1929, some skeptics wondered if it would ever be completely occupied. However, New York State government grew at a rapid pace after the war, and by 1949 expanding governmental services required even more office space, as did companies seeking close proximity to state government. Albany landlords began either leasing existing buildings or constructing new ones to meet the need. In that year alone, the state's annual rental bill for office and storage space in and around Albany totaled \$1,436,187.80. With its proximity to the capitol, Center Square was an ideal location for new office space. Recognizing the opportunity, prominent local realtor Bernard Picotte constructed the first new office building during the period of significance at 324 State Street in 1949. This building was constructed solely for the purposes of renting it to New York State as office space for the state's insurance department. The building was aptly named the "Picotte Building." <sup>12</sup> Eight more new buildings, predominantly commercial, were built in the historic district over the next ten years. They occupy scattered sites at 254 and 324 State St, 75 Chestnut, 21-25 Delaware Ave, 85 Dove Street, 244 and 259 Lark Street, and 90 and 100 Swan St. All were built between ca.1950 and 1957 and generally embody a restrained modern style, featuring clean lines and generous glazing. Specifically, they are two and three stories tall, rectangular in form, built with steel frames and brick veneer, and feature ribbon windows, flat canopies, and abstracted classical motifs. With their modest size and scale, similar materials, yet contemporary and stylish execution, these buildings are distinguishable and complementary to the district's earlier architecture. They introduce a new element of commerce that was directly related to the growth of state government in this period, and they are intact representative examples of their

periods and types. <sup>13</sup> Although these buildings were originally listed as "intrusions" in the original district nomination due to their age, they are now more than fifty years old and can be recognized as illustrating the district's next stages of development.

#### **Urban Pioneers and Preservation**

After the majority of the nine new buildings had been constructed in Center Square, a group of recently arrived residents who called themselves "Urban Pioneers" became concerned about the demolition and development pressures in their neighborhood. These Urban Pioneers were middle- and upper-class professionals who were attracted to Center Square despite its run-down condition. Despite changes, the neighborhood still retained vestiges of its privileged past, both socially and architecturally. It was its rich cultural heritage as well as the many blocks of intact nineteenth-century housing that made the neighborhood particularly attractive for investment. A period of renovation in the neighborhood ensued, with single families buying elegant old row houses and renovating the buildings to serve as individual family homes once again. 15

The Center Square Association was officially organized in 1958, when thirty-five residents met at the Westminster Presbyterian Church on 85 Chestnut Street and agreed to organize to maintain their neighborhood as a desirable residential area. <sup>16</sup>News of plans for the South Mall (Empire State Plaza), an immense government complex which was set to demolish a ninety-eight-acre working-class neighborhood just east of Central Square, galvanized the group to get involved in city and state historic preservation efforts and petition for zoning changes that would effectively protect the district from urban renewal and new development. Their local success, along with the effects of the early National Register nomination, have kept the neighborhood looking much the same today as it did then.

By the early 1960s, the attempts that were mounted to revitalize this section of Albany were in part defined by the urban renewal practices of the era, which partially reshaped the downtown landscape

but ultimately did not impact the Center Square/Hudson-Park Historic District. As gentrification began to take hold in this largely residential district, middle- and upper-class residents formed the Center Square Neighborhood Association (CSA) in 1958 and successfully petitioned local and state government to put protections in place that effectively stalled demolitions and new construction by 1968. However, prior to the formation of the CSA and during its nascent stages, a number of buildings were constructed to satisfy an ongoing demand for commercial office space. More characteristically modern buildings, typical of office building styles of this period, inspired by Modern movement styles which feature clean lines and generous glazing, that were distinguishable and complementary to the district's earlier architectural stock were built during this time period. Although these buildings were originally listed as "intrusions" in the original district nomination, they are now recognized as examples of modern architecture that should be considered contributing to a district.

Today, Center Square-Hudson Park in one of Albany's most intact and desirable historic neighborhoods. This additional documentation, including the long-overdue resource list, methodology, and expanded period of significance, will enhance preservation opportunities for both residents and investors.
