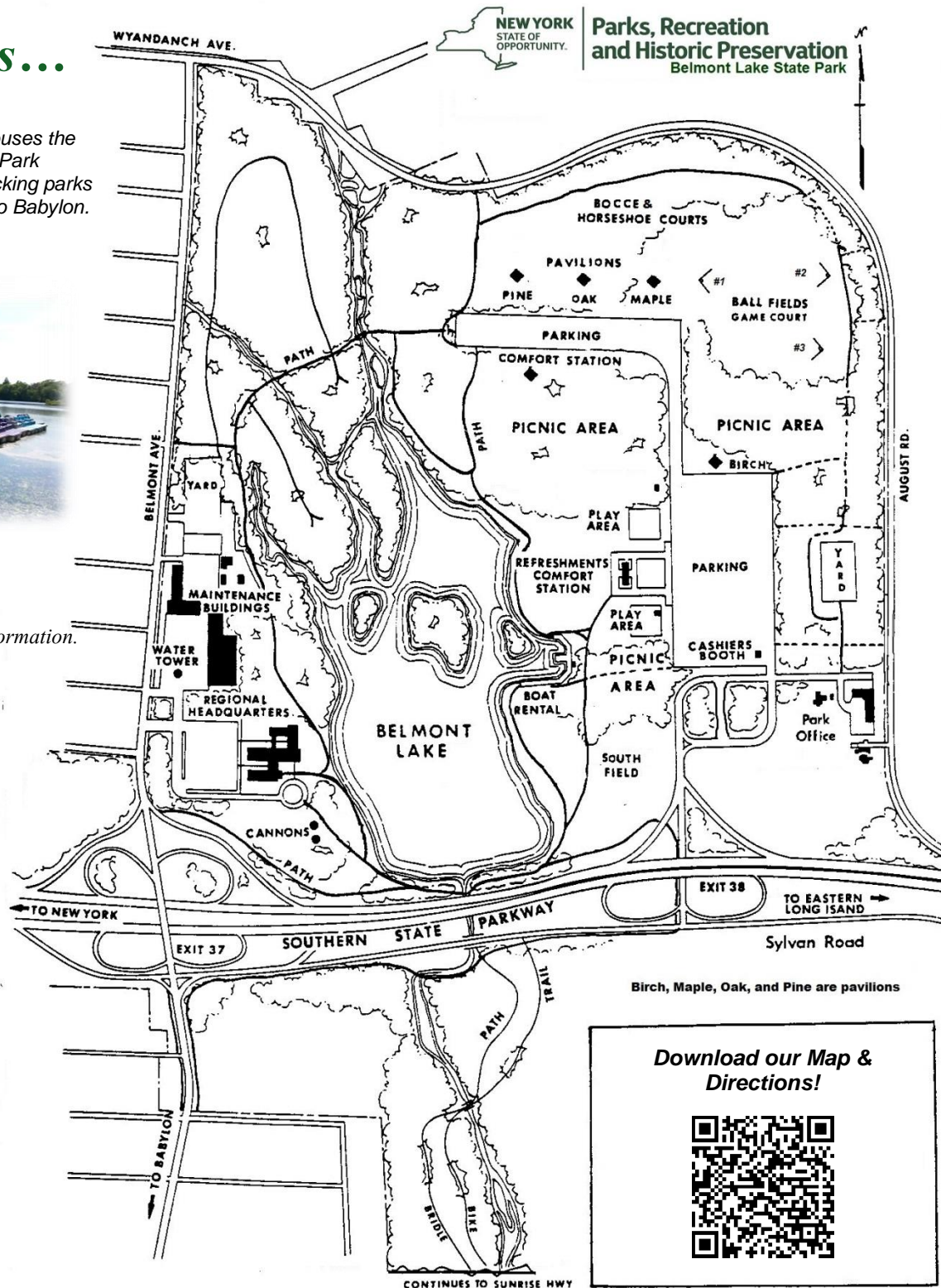

Directions...

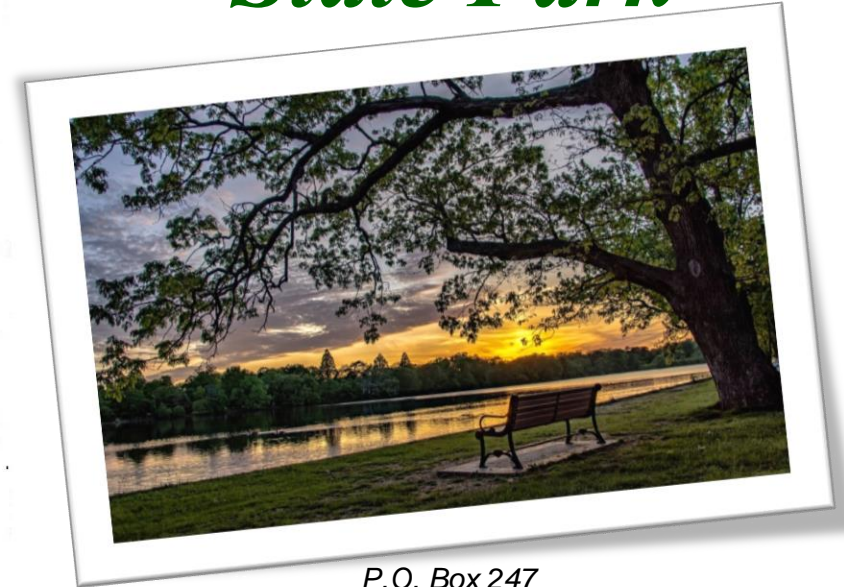
42 miles from Manhattan

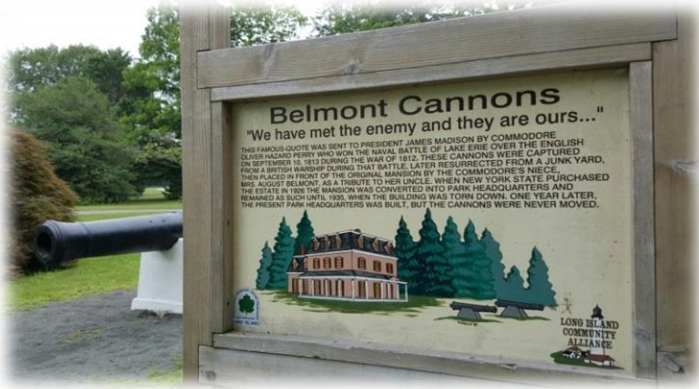

Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation

A Brief History...



The August Belmont country estate of 1,100 acres was formerly devoted to the breeding of thoroughbred horses. In 1885 August Belmont moved his racing stock to a new establishment in Kentucky.

Upon August Belmont Jr.'s death in 1924, the lands were passed to his widow Eleanor Robson Belmont, a famous American actress and playwright. Early in 1924, she sold all but a small portion of the estate to Cadman H. Frederick who subdivided most of it into lots. The remaining 158 acres, including the lake, the mansion, and the main farm buildings were sold to the State of New York. In 1927, the State purchased land that had been retained by Mrs. Belmont. Since that time, further acquisitions have brought the total acreage of Belmont Lake State Park to 459.

The family mansion was used for a time as the Long Island State Park Commission administration headquarters. In 1935 it was razed to make way for the present office building, which was erected on the site of the Belmont estate's Episcopal Chapel. In addition to the office building, the central maintenance and shop buildings are located there.

Environment...

The park has wetland and freshwater habitats which attracts numerous birds. **American wigeon, Canvasbacks, Scaup, Mergansers**, and many other species of waterfowl can be seen in the winter on the 28 acre lake. During the summer, the great **Blue Heron** can be seen walking along the lake shore hunting for fish. **Warblers** can be observed along the nature trail that encircles the lake during spring and fall migration. *A bird checklist is available at the park office.*

In the spring, hikers can see an abundance of **Spring Azure Butterflies** flying low to the ground, and **Mourning Cloak Butterflies** emerging from the tree hollows. Each June, **Painted and Snapping Turtles** come ashore to lay eggs. Walking on the park's woodland trails, you are likely to see **Box Turtles, Squirrels** and **Eastern Cottontail Rabbits**.

In the fall and spring the lake is stocked with **Brown, Brook and Rainbow Trout**. All year-round, **Largemouth Bass, Bluegill, Pumpkinseed, Brown Bullhead, Yellow Perch**, and **Carp** inhabit the lake.

Special Services...

Golden Park Program

Senior Citizens, persons 62 years of age or older who are New York State residents, can have unlimited weekday and non-holiday access to all state parks and discounts on certain fees by showing their New York State driver's license or New York State non-driver identification.

Access Pass

The Access Pass is available to New York State residents with qualifying disabilities. The pass provides free or reduced entry and use of state parks and recreation areas and their facilities. Not included are special events, programs, services, and facilities provided by concessionaires and utilities for camping. Applications are available to mail from Access Pass, New York State Parks, Albany, New York, 12238.

Lifetime Liberty Pass

The Lifetime Liberty Pass provides New York State veterans with a 40 percent or greater service-connected-disability, discounted use of parks, historic sites, and recreational facilities operated by the New York State parks. Not included are special events, programs, services, and facilities provided by concessionaires and utilities for camping. Applications are available to mail from Access Pass/Lifetime Liberty Pass, New York State Parks, Albany, New York, 12238.

Empire Passport Card

The Empire Passport provides unlimited free vehicle entry to most state park and recreation areas, but does not cover activity fees, or off-roading fees.

The Empire Passport Card can be used in any vehicle and is good for one vehicle at a time. (Valid January 1 – December 31).

The Empire Passport Card can be purchased in person at certain parks (please call (631)321-3770 for listing), online, or by mail from Passport, New York State Parks, Albany, New York 12238.
